
The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated as part of worship on May 6 and 20 at 8:30 and 10:30 a.m.

Over the summer, we will be introducing "First Web." First Web is our new congregational management software that will enable us to keep up-to-date information on our members and


We'll be sharing more information and schedule regarding First Web. Stay tuned! We promise to make it as easy (and painless) as possible!
